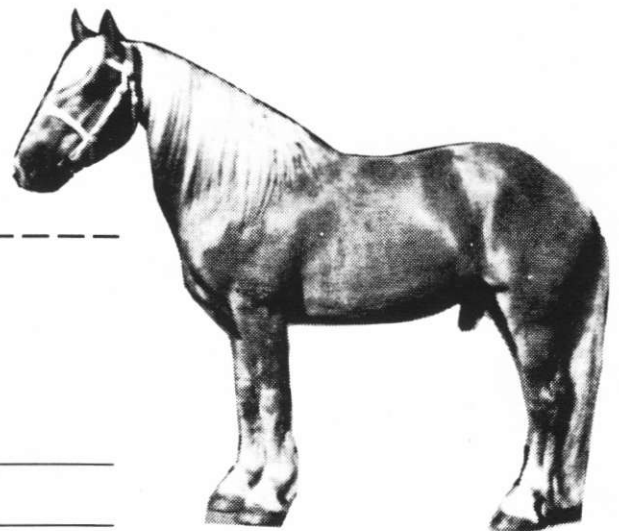

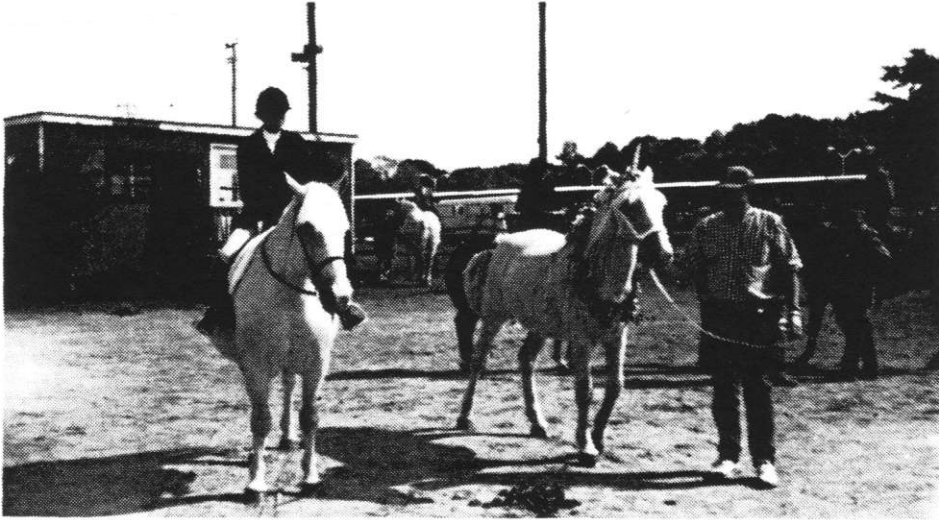

HAPPENINGS IN 1992



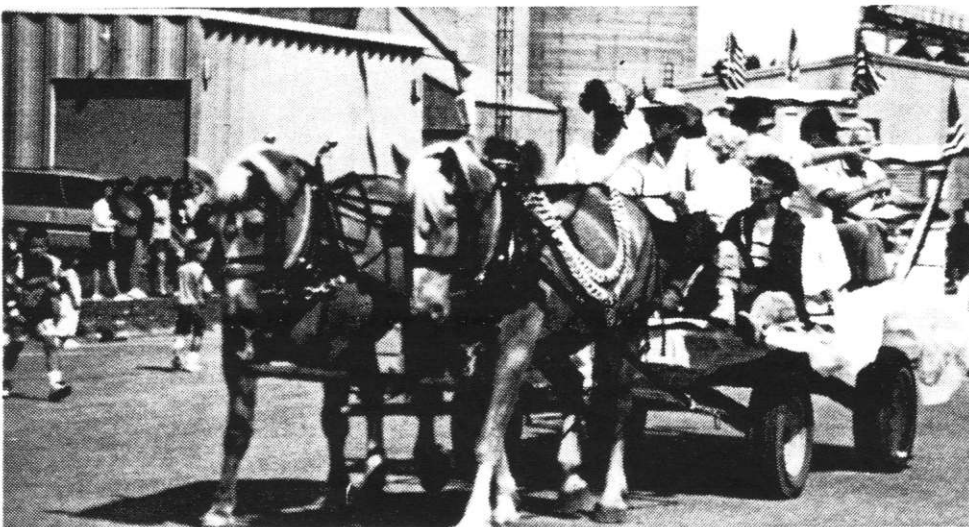
