
Getting off to an early start this year, as we recently returned from the National Endangered Equine Summit

has recently retired, yet still stays active in research projects. He is willing to address the topic of Equine Genetics and the use of DNA/ Blood Typing at the ACDHA 2019 Annual Meeting.

Out West, the next event for our "Creams" will be at the St. Patrick's Day Parade March 17th. We'll spend the last week in April driving through the mountains and several mining towns on the 49r Wagon Train, then head to the high desert mid- June for the Reno Rodeo Cattle Drive. and beautiful story.....


Heather, please keep us updated! And thank you for also becoming a member of ACDHA!! We love having wonderful people like you, with a personality that lights up Fields of Creams!!

This is a 500-acre Resort with pool, golf, hiking, and more. Maine has the slogan of VACATIONLAND, so please come and enjoy the natural beauty that Maine has to offer – ocean, mountains, lakes, forests, history, and lobstah!



If you fly in, the closest airport is the Portland Jetport, MAINE (PWM). The Resort is about 35 miles north of the Jetport up I-95, take Exit 63 to Rt 26N. You may also fly into Boston airport, and take the Concord (bus) to the Portland Jetport for a very minimal cost, or drive (about 2.5 hrs to resort). There is an Amtrak station in Portland as an additional option of travel.





The meeting on Friday will be held in the Water Museum on the Resort grounds. *Please remember your item for the silent auction!

Lunch will be supplied by the resort services. I will provide possible choices, prices, and any additional lunch information in the next newsletter.

ARTICLE III. POSITIONS

- All Directors shall have regular access to an e-mail address.
- E. The Board of Directors shall have the following positions: President, Vice-President, and a Secretary/Treasurer and have six Directors.
